ccommodations: Sleeps up to 5. Rode Locker right forward with Vee Berths next aft, Enclosed Head aft to port with Sink and Manual WC, and Large Hanging Lockers opposite to starboard. In the Main Cabin there are Settee Berths port & starboard, Stowage Lockers outboard, and Drop-Leaf Table between. Bulkheads and Overhead are White with Bright Trim, and there is a Solid Fuel Stove mounted on the Forward Bulkhead to port. The Galley is aft to port with 2-Burner Alcohol Stove, Ice Box, and Stainless Steel Sink w/ Manual Pump. Opposite the Galley to starboard is a Quarter Berth which also doubles as a Chart Table. The Finish Work below is Very Well Done and the Quality of Construction is evident throughout.

Comments: LYRA is a particularly handsome example of a Phil Rhodes-designed auxiliary sloop, which was built to very high standards by Matthiessen & Paulsen in Germany. In 1985-86 she was extensively rebuilt after having been storm damaged, and this work was done in a first class Maine yard where she has been stored and maintained since. This rebuild was very well done and included removal of ballast and checking of keel bolts; new rudder; reframing and planking as required; new floor timber; rebuilding of engine to include grinding crankshaft, camshafts and valves, new bearings, rebuilt carburetor; new stem head and rudder heel castings; repair of deck covering board and bluwarks; new electrical system. The quality of craftsmanship and design in this high pedigree sloop is evident throughout, and we feel that she can be very highly recommended for one desiring a particularly good-looking high quality cruising sloop in this size range.
